2.3.2 - Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

YES - IGIDR has a system of Student Mentoring. All incoming students are provided faculty mentors, who have helped students in their course choices and career decisions. At the beginning of the semester, the Dean's Office assigns each incoming student to a faculty mentor. Every student is required to meet his/her assigned faculty mentor at the beginning of the semester and periodically. The mentor has a detailed discussion with the assigned student and seeks to find the student's background and his/her areas of strength and weakness. The mentor also briefs the student about the academic programme, its degree of difficulty and how the student can effectively cope with it and perform to the best of his/her ability. The student is also encouraged to pose queries on his/her areas of concern if any on the academic programme and campus life in general. The faculty also advises the student to reach out to him/her or any concerned authority in case a student faces any form of problem on campus. The student is advised to meet the mentor regularly, especially before and after assessments and for any learning problems that he/she may be facing so that course correction can be made at the earliest. Finally, a student can approach the mentor for advising him/her on the fields of specializations and research areas/career that the student would like to pursue. Over the years, the mentoring programme at IGIDR has been running successfully and students have appreciated the contribution of the programme.

Library Resources: The library (<http://www.igidr.ac.in/library-2/>) has an excellent collection of books, journals, and databases in the institutes areas of study and research. For the effective utilization of its resources and physical facility, the library is kept open for 16.30 hours a day and 360 days in a year starting from 8.00 am till 12.30 Midnight with extended timings during exam time. All the members of the library have borrowing privileges as per the library rules and get access to e-resources through campus network 24x7. It has made available links to online e-journals, e-resources, a list of monthly

additions of books, new arrivals, e-library, digital library, open index initiative, and catalogue from its website, and home page of the library OPAC (<http://opac.igidr.ac.in>). All of the datasets and e-documents have been given access through E-Library through the campus networks. It has also established a network with different academic and research libraries for undertaking resource sharing. For the upkeep of the physical space, the library undertakes regular cleaning activities and it is fully air-conditioned with cubicles and Wi-Fi to provide a congenial environment for library users to study and research. Support staff also provides training to users on how to use various IT services like, WiFi, computers, Email and other IT services. All computers and audio/visuals equipment are under annual comprehensive maintenance. Quarterly preventive maintenance is being done by the vendors to keep the computers and equipment in good working condition. Computer centre is open 24/7 for users. Class rooms and seminar rooms are being utilized by booking and scheduling of the same by the Admin assistance and soffice through software. Infrastructure Facilities: The IGIDR has physical and support facilities in the campus which includes office spaces, residential buildings for faculty and staff, student hostel, guest house, library, recreation center for indoor games, outdoor tennis court, classrooms, gymnasium, swimming pool, air conditioning systems, and lifts. 8.Future Plans of Actions for Next Academic Year

- Connectivity with Indian institutions and universities Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR) has strengthened the ties with University in India and abroad. The tie-ups are for the betterment of the profession in the domain of developmental economics and thereby enriching the students for updates knowledge. The IGIDR has planned to extend the connectivity with a greater number of universities and domain specific higher education institute for sharing of knowledge, joint research activities and promotion of students in the domain of economics and development research. The connectivity will be multiplied in the phased manner. The strategies planned for the connectivity are, conference and seminar, add on course, research and more popular visiting scholar program and visiting student program. The existing institute mechanism will be utilized to set up the connectivity.
- Recruit talented faculty at all levels The IGIDR has the history of the talent professors who has contributed in many professional areas. The IGIDR has further plans to recruit the talented faculty for teaching the curriculum and research at institute. It is being planned to identify the domain specific and curriculum-based talent and appoint them. The plan has also been envisaged to appoint adjunct faculties with due policy support from the board of directors of IGIDR.
- Conduct academic audit on a regular basis Academic audit shall follow the scientific and systematic method of reviewing the quality of academic process in the institution. It is related with the quality assurance and enhancing the quality of academic activities in HEIs. And administrative Audit is the process of evaluating the efficiency and effectiveness of the administrative procedure is designed based on the guidelines provided by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council. It includes assessment of policies, strategies functions of the various administrative departments, control of the overall administrative system etc. The institute has planned to develop the unique methodology for conducting AAA. It is expected that each HEI may evolve its own guidelines and methodology by learning from good practices followed by leading institutions within and outside India. The successful practices can be adapted to suit

specific context and requirement of HEI on various aspects. The IGIDR shall exercise AAA once in year. Since peer review is backbone of AAA, similar to accreditation by NAAC, it is important to select good experts as peers for AAA, the IDIDR have plan to constitute the committee of experts to attain the objectives of IQAC. The IGIDR have plan to devise its own process including self-evaluation by faculty and administrative units, schedule of onsite visit, format of report and outcome etc. However, it fulfilling the basic requirements of NAAC guidelines with respect to AAA.
